DERBYSHIRE FESTIVAL SHOW RULES

Please Note: It is the competitors'/exhibitors' responsibility to enter the correct class and allow for appropriate time clashing of classes. **CLASSES WILL NOT BE HELD.**

Please see our website for our Social Media Policy.

ANY ABUSIVE LANGUAGE or BEHAVIOUR TOWARDS SHOW OFFICIALS, ANIMALS or FELLOW COMPETITORS WILL RESULT IN EXPULSION FROM THE SHOWGROUND and by entering this Show you agree to abide this and all of the the following:

- 1 This Show is not open to the Public and operates under the NCPA Child and Vulnerable Adult Protection Policy.
- 2 All persons entering the showground must have Personal and Public Liability Insurance. The Committee will not be held responsible for any damage, loss or injury to any animal, person or property whilst on the showground. Under **NO** circumstances must anyone other than the Judge, Stewards, Competitors and Grooms enter the show rings (Grooms please show respect and dress correctly).
- 3 The Judges' decision is final. Any objections must be made, in writing, within one hour of the class/incident and handed to the Secretary with a deposit of £30.
- 4 The Committee reserve the right to amalgamate, cancel or divide classes as entries warrant.
- 5 The Committee reserve the right to return or refuse any entry made either by post or via the on-line entry system.
- 6 Under **NO** circumstances will entries be substituted and any refunds will be totally at the discretion of the committee and will be subject to the £10 admin charge.
- 7 In the event of postponement all entries will be carried over to the new date unconditionally.
- 8 In the event of cancellation, refunds **MUST** be requested in writing (**NO** emails) and should be sent with a SAE enclosed to the Show Secretary within 28 days of the show date and will be subject to a £10 admin charge.
- 9 Mountain and Moorland ponies will be shown in accordance to the Breed Society rules.
- 10 All ridden Show Pony and Show Hunter Pony classes are held in accordance with the BSPS current rule book unless otherwise stated.
- 11 In-foal mares may be asked to produce a certificate of service.
- 12 Stallions may not be lead by children under the age of 14 years to qualify for PUK Championships.
- 13 All trophies will remain the property of the show and must be signed for. They will be held for the remainder of the year and must be returned to the show upon request; clean, and in good condition.
- 14 All Postal entries must provide a suitable SAE with the correct postage for return of numbers.
- 15 In the interest of safety, excessive assistance or interference from outside the ring will not be tolerated.
- 16 The Committee reserve the right to carry out random dope testing.
- 17 Dishonoured cheques will incur a £10 administration fee and may result in entries being refused in the future.
- 18 All riding hats should adhere to the current British Standard.
- 19 **All data given by competitors is stored on our on-line system and may be shared with other societies. By entering via the on-line system competitors, owners, riders and handlers give their consent to this and agree to abide by the Rules and Conditions of this Show.**

PRIZE MONEY:

Full Prize Money will be awarded in each class providing there are a minimum of 6 entries; if less, then 1st Prize Money **ONLY** will be awarded.

ALL Prize Money must be collected on the day, otherwise it will be deemed a donation to the Society.

HOYS: 1st £35; 2nd £20; 3rd £10; 4th £5.

RIHS: 1st £35; 2nd £20; 3rd £10; 4th £5.

STANDARD: 1st £25; 2nd £10; 3rd £5.

BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION

Classes 19-28, 53-55, 101-103, 164-168, 191 are held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Riders/handlers must be 15 years of age or older. For classes 19-21, 53-55, 101-103 all riders, owners and producers must be members of BSHA. Horses must be registered with BSHA or have temporary membership via a Day Ticket.

Classes 22-25 are qualifiers for Horse of the Year Show. All riders, owners and producers must be members of BSHA. Horses must be registered with BSHA.

Classes 164-167 191 are qualifiers for Horse of the Year Show. All riders, owners and producers must be members of BSHA, TSR or SHB. Horses must be registered with TSR or SHB.

Class 168 is a qualifier for Horse of the Year Show. All riders, owners and producers must be members of BSHA, TSR or SHB (Hunters only). Horses must be registered with TSR or SHB.

Qualification will not pass below fifth place. For Horse of the Year Show Working Hunter classes, qualification will not pass below third place. Qualification will be verified by Horse of the Year Show Office.

Horses competing at the Horse of the Year Show and qualifying shows in the Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain classes at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs or Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB(GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes. Entries in these classes may not compete in the Small Show Hunter of the Year and vice versa.

Classes 26-29 are qualifiers for The Royal International Horse Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify; if first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward, with the exception of BSHA shows, where qualification will go down the line. Horses competing at the R.I.H.S. and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding horse classes at the same show and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB(GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of HOYS Ladies Side Saddle and HOYS Working Hunter classes). Recipients of the Young Rider rosette will qualify for the BSHA Young Rider of the Year at the National Championship Show in September 2024. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.

S.H.B.G.B. In the North West – In-hand Points Champion

Hunter Breeding Classes and In-hand Sport Horse classes are included in the S.H.B.(G.B.) in the North West In-hand Points Competition. Points will be awarded to 1st-4th places in each class. An Award will be made to the horse attaining the highest number of points overall. To qualify, horses that are not registered at the time of the Show must be registered or overstamped with SHB(GB) by 30th September 2024.

S.H.B.G.B. In the North West – Ridden Points Champion

The following classes at the show: WORKING HUNTER; RIDDEN HUNTER are included in the S.H.B.(G.B.) in the North West Ridden Points Competition. Points will be awarded to 1st-4th places in each class. Horses must be registered with SHB to qualify. Horses can compete in any of the above classes. An award will be made to the horse attaining the highest number of points overall.

QUALIFYING SHOW for UK PONIES & HORSES SPRING CLASSIC (24/A18/8350)

The 1st, 2nd and 3rd placed competitors in all appropriate classes will qualify for the UK Ponies & Horses Spring Classic 2025 at Onley Grounds Equestrian Centre. No membership is required to enter or compete in any Championship Final. Qualification cards will not be given in the ring; however, results can be verified by the office.

NORTHERN COUNTIES PONY ASSOCIATION – PONY of the YEAR

The Pony of the Year Show will be held in September 2024. All those who qualify, to enter must be a current member of the N.C.P.A. and for membership forms please send a s.a.e. to N.C.P.A. Office, 11 Mawdsley Close, Formby, Liverpool L37 8DJ; or download at www.thencpa.co.uk

THE B.S.P.S. CHALLENGE - Rule 516 (2024 Handbook)

All Shows that are affiliated to the B.S.P.S. are qualifiers for the "BSPS Rogers Truck Services Ltd Challenge". Animals competing in the following Open classes will qualify: Open LR, First Ridden, Lead Rein Hunter Type, Show Pony, SHP, WHP, Intermediate SH, SRT and WH and Open Heritage LR, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP classes.

THE B.S.P.S. BLUE RIBAND PONY of the YEAR

The 1st & 2nd placed pony will qualify in the following classes: Horse of the Year Show Pony, Lead Rein, First Ridden, Intermediate SRT & SH and Show Hunter Pony classes. Owners and riders must be BSPS Members and the Pony registered with BSPS to qualify.

HORSE OF THE YEAR SHOW QUALIFYING CLASSES

This is a Horse of the Year Qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Ltd and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. For full policy details please visit www.granstandentries.com Horse of the Year Show Qualifiers will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rule book, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk Qualification will be verified by Horse of the Year Show office. For M&M classes ponies to be registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of, the main body of their respective stud books. Owners and riders may also be a member with their respective breed society.

NPS MOUNTAIN and MOORLAND QUALIFYING ROUNDS

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-breds are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS. Life or qualifying members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition, at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The highest placed pony if owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life Member will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third. Owners' membership cards to be shown in the ring.

NPS Corscaron Horse Essentials Home Produced Ridden Championship - wear white armbands where indicated.

NPS SHOW PONY and SHOW HUNTER PONY QUALIFYING ROUNDS

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register or Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB, the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB or in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-breds are not eligible unless entered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register or Appendix International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB. Ponies must be plaited.

Qualifying rounds are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but in the In-hand sections only ponies owned by Qualifying or Life NPS members will qualify for the final of the competition. In ridden classes the owner must become a Qualifying or Life Member in order to enter the final Owners' membership cards to be shown in the ring.

The highest placed pony if owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in each class will qualify for the Final. Qualification may pass down to 3rd place. Please note that foals are not eligible for these Championships.

NPS SILVER MEDAL ROSETTE CHAMPIONSHIPS

To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the Owner of the champion pony is a qualifying or Life Member of the NPS. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the Owner of that pony is a Member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can go no lower than first Reserve. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the Final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show, August 2024. Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Rosette Championships. Owners' membership cards must be shown in the ring to receive the medal and/or qualification. All In-hand Silver Medal Championships are qualifiers for NPS Breed Champions Prelim Round at the Great British In-hand Show, September 2024.

IRISH DRAUGHT (GB)

This Show is affiliated to the Irish Draught Society (GB) and as such exhibits entering classes 99 and 100 should be eligible under the following criteria.

In-hand Yearling, two and three year old COLTS must be bitted and shown by an experienced handler of 18 years of age or over. All three year old colts must be uninspected.

Owners of Pure Bred Irish Draught horses must be full members of the IDHS(GB) and the horse:

Must be registered with, or over stamped by the IDHS(GB) and in the correct ownership;

Must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.

Owners of Irish Draught Sport Horses do not have to be members of the IDHS (GB) but the horses must have a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding and be registered on the IDHS (GB) Irish Draught Sport Horse Register or over stamped by IDHS (GB). They must be on the correct ownership.

NPS /BLACKERTOR / SHARPTOR STUDS M&M IN-HAND SILVER MEDAL ROSETTES CHAMPIONSHIP

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS qualifying or Life member in the Mountain & Moorland In-hand section. To be run under NPS Rules. Conditions as above.

ARAB HORSE SOCIETY

All Pure and Part-bred Arab classes, in-hand and ridden are run under A.H.S. 2024 Rules.

This Show is a qualifier for the British Horse Feeds and IDHS (GB) Ridden Championship Series.

The 2 highest placed horses (not already qualified) from classes 43 and 44 will qualify for the final to be held at the **Agria Royal International Horse Show Hickstead**, on July 27th 2024. Qualification can be passed to third place if the highest-placed horses have already qualified and if in the opinion of the judges, the exhibit is of sufficient quality.

All horses must be in the correct ownership and must be 4 years and over and 153cms (15hh) or over.

Class 43 - Ridden Purebred Irish Draught - first two qualify. Open to mares, stallions and geldings, 4 years and over, registered with or over stamped by the IDHS (B).

Class 44 - Ridden Irish Draught Sport Horse - first two to qualify. Open to mares, stallions and geldings, 4 years old and over, registered on the Irish Draught Sport Horse Register.

I will sneak out in the middle of a summer night and ride the old bay gelding across the moonstruck meadow if my old bones will allow it.

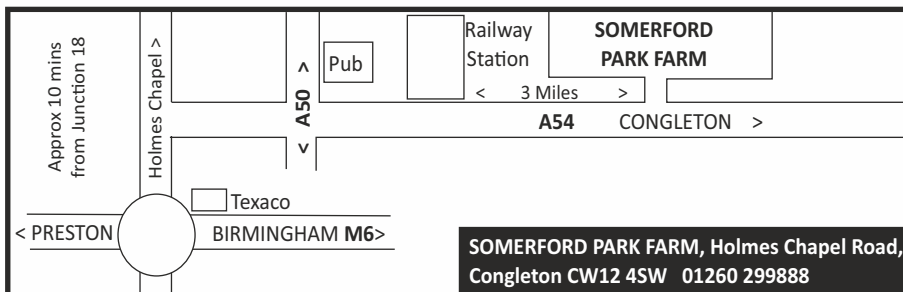

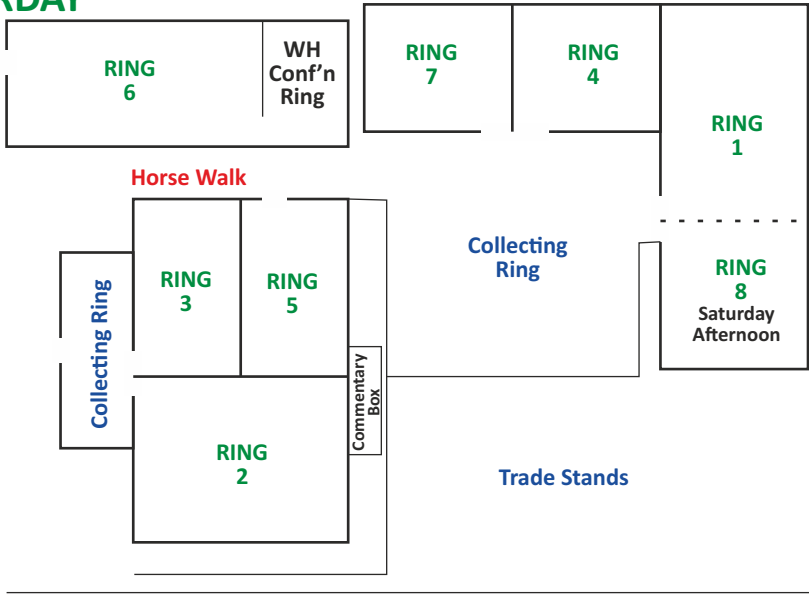

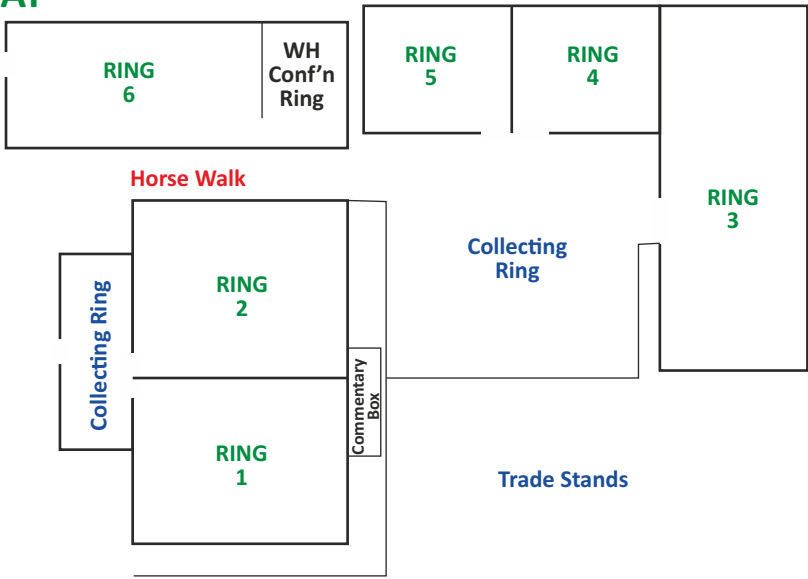
